

## Summary of 2018 Examination Performance Measures

The following data outlines the key performance indicators following the 2017-18 examinations. In 2018, the majority of subjects at GCSE were graded using a 1-9 scale (with 9 being the highest grade) rather than A\*-G. The only exceptions to this were Statistics and Design/Technology subjects.
