What really is an apprenticeship?

- Earn while you are learn! Many companies offer great perks too!!
- Employed to do a real full-time job whilst studying for a real qualification.
- Paid off-the-job training (6 hours of your working week towards your apprenticeship qualification)
- Gaining and demonstrating knowledge, skills and behaviours in the world of work.
- Progression onto another apprenticeship or a pathway into a future career. Many Managers and Owners were Apprentices.
- Apprenticeships take 1 to 5 years to complete depending on the level.





Apprenticeship Levels:

Level 2 (Intermediate Apprenticeship)

• Equivalent to 5 GCSE's 4 – 9

Level 3 (Advanced Apprenticeship)

Equivalent to 2 A-levels


Level 4 & 5 (Higher Apprenticeships)

Equivalent to foundation degree level


Level 6 & 7 (Higher Degree Apprenticeships)



Inclusive apprenticeships

Inclusive apprenticeships are designed to break down barriers and create employment opportunities for people with cognitive, physical, mental health and sensory disabilities.



Inclusive Apprenticeships provide:

- An alternative and flexible approach to mainstream education, which is tailored towards the individuals chosen career path
- A supportive environment for learners to develop the skills and experience needed to succeed in their chosen careers.
- The hours and duration of the apprenticeship can be adjusted to accommodate the individuals needs
- Additional support to help you succeed!

Apprenticeships Suffolk Pilot Projects

Pathway to Apprenticeships



An extension of the current service Apprenticeships Suffolk provide to those individuals who are not apprenticeship/work ready yet due to barriers preventing them from achieving a sustainable apprenticeship opportunity. Therefore, providing a service with 121 support and group activities to create a wraparound holistic support and mentoring service to build on employability skills and confidence to progress into an apprenticeship opportunity.





SWAPS (Sector Work Based Academy)



Sector-based work academies help prepare those receiving unemployment benefits or currently not in work to apply for apprenticeship or employment opportunities in different areas of work. These 6 week placements are designed to help meet our employers immediate and future recruitment needs as well as to recruit and support candidates with the right skills through a 3 stage approach combining practical and learning methods all with a guaranteed job interview at the end.



Functional Skills Qualifications

Functional skills are a key component in all apprenticeship standards. Functional skills are qualifications taught to post-16 and adult learners, which teach them how to apply practical Maths and English skills to real-life and vocational contexts.





You will be required to complete an initial assessment in maths and English with your Training Provider or College to identify what level you are working at. For intermediate apprenticeships you will be required to have at least a Level 1 Functional Skills maths and English and will be working towards a Level 2 alongside your apprenticeship. For advanced and higher apprenticeships, you will be required to have your Level 2 Functional Skills maths and English.

For an apprentice with a EHCP these rules may differ and discussed with the individual.



Consider your interests - What is it you want to do in the future? You can access online career/ personality quizzes to help you discover possible career options based on your interests, skills and attributes. Examples of these can be found on "I can be a..." and "The Buzz Quiz" websites.

☑ **Do your research** – How can I get into my preferred industry? What qualifications/ experience will I need?

TO DO LIST:

- Attend career events (virtual or in person). Set up a LinkedIn profile.
- Find local employers and approach to request some work experience.
- <u>Build your CV</u> and cover letter for job applications.
- ☑ Consider doing a Pre-apprenticeship programme or traineeship
- ☑ Register on National Apprenticeship Service gov.uk for current apprenticeship opportunities.
- Register with Apprenticeships Suffolk where you will receive ongoing support from our Participant Advisor. You will receive our Wednesday Weekly which shares are current live job vacancies, and you will be invited to apply to new opportunities within our service.
