Examinations

Students in Art and Design (unendorsed) and Photography undertake an examination project in the spring term of year 11 and create a practical sketchbook project based upon a theme provided by the examination board (AQA), This then culminates in a 10 hour exam in controlled conditions. The exam project comprises 40% of the total assessed mark. A mock examination takes place before Christmas in Year 11 and prepares the students for the conditions of the final examination.

Assessments

All examination work is assessed internally by Mr Clark and his team, and is then moderated by AQA. Guidance and feedback is given continuously in the run up to the examination.

Additional support being provided by school

Support material, handouts, checklists and feedback is provided continually during the examination project. Intervention portfolio surgeries are available after school every week to support with the development of this work, and additional sessions will be available during the Easter holidays.

How parents and carers can best support their child

Monitoring the progress of students through the coursework and examination components by reviewing the checklists and guidance booklets and how far each of them have progressed against each task is extremely valuable. The Art team are always happy to answer questions about any students progress and welcome active engagement with their work. Please feel free to contact the team by email or phone for additional information about specific support.

Additional support sessions are being offered on a Monday after school in order to ensure Unit 1 and Unit 2 have been completed. Any students with work outstanding or improvements to be made will be expected to attend these sessions.

Students are able to access rehearsal spaces anytime during lunch and should be rehearsing for their Unit 3 performance at least twice a week in preparation for their exam which will be in April/May. Mrs French is running a workshop day on Thursday 13th April, during the Easter holidays and every group is expected to attend. These have been arranged to accommodate other revision sessions and students will be informed of their rehearsal dates. Students will also be taking part in a Samuel Ward Academy Trust Drama workshop day on March 8th at Castle Manor School. Students will share some of their work so far and receive feedback from a panel of staff. They will also take part in 3 workshops to help enhance their performance skills ready for their Unit 3 exam.

In preparation for the Unit 3 exam parents could rehearse lines with their son/daughter. Students could be encouraged to attend additional rehearsal sessions with their group at least twice a week.

Controlled Assessments (ISAs) will have been completed in lessons before Easter to ensure there is sufficient time in class to prepare for the examinations but for Triple Science students there will be one final opportunity to improve their ISA marks in each Science if desired during the Easter holidays. The dates are Biology Tuesday 11 April, Chemistry Wednesday 12 April and Physics Thursday 13 April. Students will be required to attend all day to complete the ISA and must register for this with their Science teacher before the Easter holidays.

Additional support being provided by school

After school revision sessions are available in all subjects. Students will be guided on how and what to revise and given appropriate materials. Students will be set preparation tasks and it is very important that these are completed. The technology exam issues a Design Brief and students are aware of this and spend time in lessons (and as preparation tasks) preparing for this. This section is worth 25% of the mark so it is vital the student is thoroughly prepared. Very specific guidance will be given by teacher.

Individual teachers will advise of the appropriate revision session for students to attend and if a student is unsure, ask the teacher.

How parents and carers can best support their child

Encourage structure and organisation to the student's revision. This will probably be a workable and reasonable plan to include their subjects. It is important to encourage self-discipline of the student to keep on track with their schedule, to encourage students to share concerns with teacher. There will be information to learn and it is important that key information which may be technical terms and key information (e.g. Properties and function of materials) is learnt, no short step to this. Use positive encouragement and motivation, all students will be able to improve their overall GCSE performance with preparation.

Ensure the student is aware and has prepared ideas for the design task.
