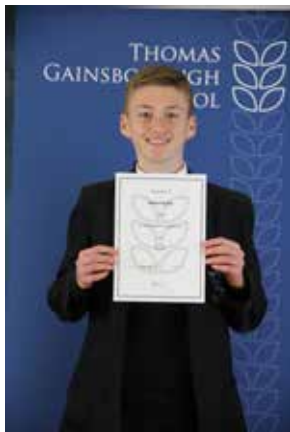

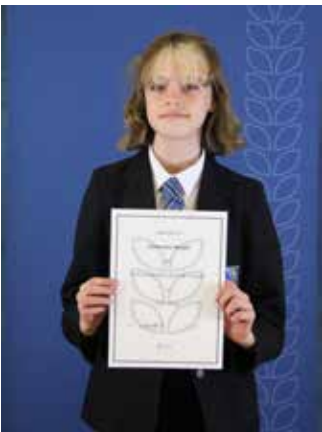

Rosie Bray

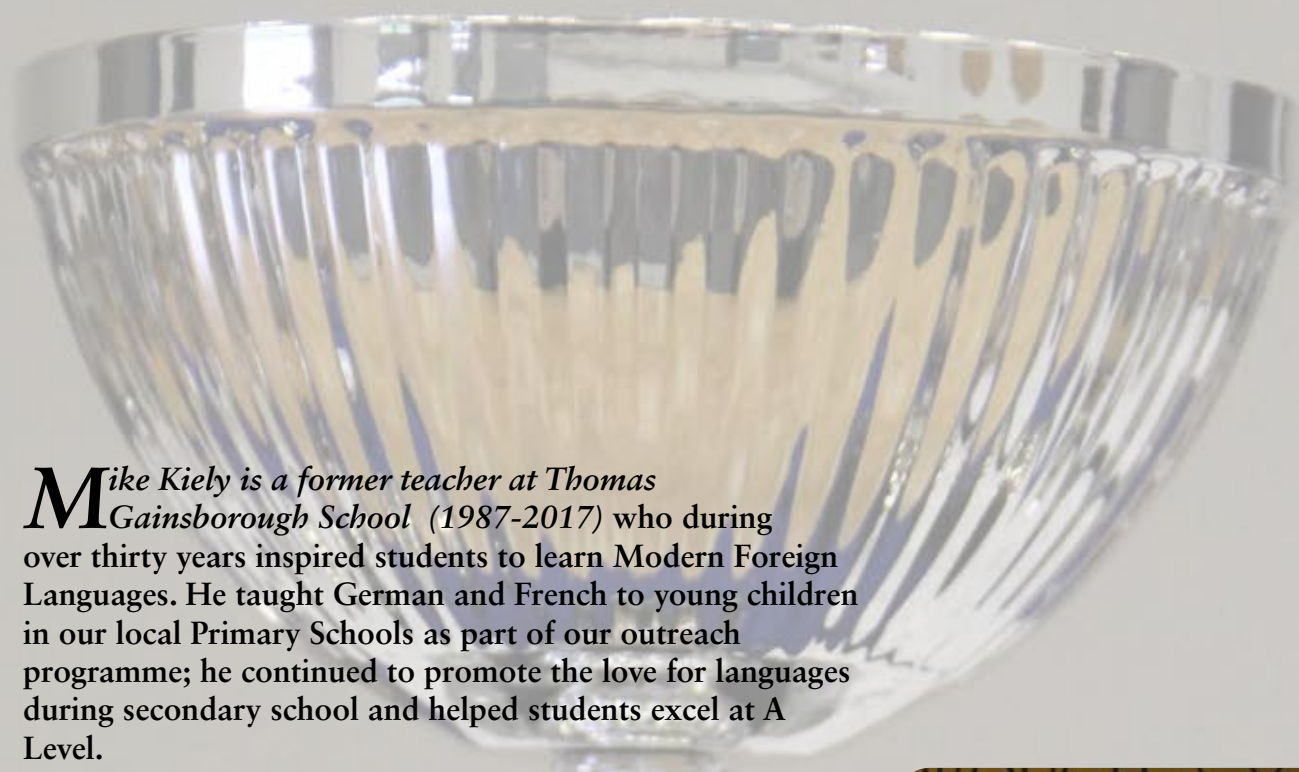

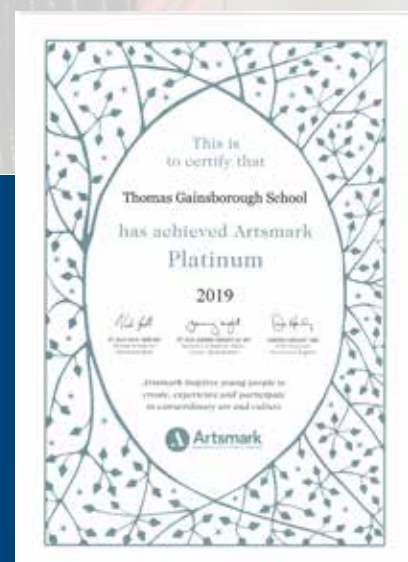


Evelyn Hughes
